Care and cows to provide relief in Vietnam

The 2017 My Coins Count project is to provide relief to families in Vietnam who live with disabilities, most associated with Agent Orange

(Dioxin). In Quang Ngai Province alone, 25,000 are affected.

The province was sprayed heavily with Agent Orange to clear vegetation during the Vietnam War, affecting civilians and soldiers on both sides of the conflict. And the horror continues, with birth defects, cancers and neurological disorders affecting young people born long after the war ended.

Collective evidence from multiple studies have led scientists, doctors and others, including the U.S. Department of Veteran Affairs, to associate a variety of health conditions with exposure to Dioxin (Agent Orange). The effects can be passed on from parent to child and can even skip a generation.

MCC is responding by supporting two initiatives in partnership with Vietnam Association for Victims of Agent Orange (VAVA) — a daytime care center and a cow bank program.

MCC provided a clean water system and exercise equipment for the daytime care center and funding for local doctors to train staff and families in physical therapy techniques. A new MCC worker, who is an occupational therapist, is scheduled to begin working with the center.

The cow bank that MCC supports through VAVA started with another small spark in 2015, with just 20 families who received a female cow, a larger investment than families could make on their own. When that cow has its first calf, its owner gives the calf to repay the loan. Female

calves are given directly to other families affected by Agent Orange. VAVA sells male calves to help purchase a female calf for a family.

This project will help families better support themselves now and increase their economic capacity for the future. “Even though the investment of the cows is very small, it has a lot of meaning,” says VAVA Chairman Long. “The final results will become very big.”

Our small coins can make a HUGE difference in these people’s lives.

Please support these vitally important projects this year to show God’s love and compassion to those who are suffering in Vietnam.
